

Additional Education Needs

LEVELS OF SUPPORT 2024-25

Academic Support is provided to students to help them develop the skills for learning and help their teachers accelerate their learning. This is achieved through a differentiated learning and behavioral support program.

- Consultative support from Student Services Teachers
- Monitoring student performance
- Literacy support (reading, writing, speaking and listening)
- Mathematics support
- Small group instruction
- Assessment accommodations

Cost: 2,500 EURO (per year)

Differentiated Support Level 1 is provided by trained professionals in a balanced service delivery model of consultative support, accommodations, small-group instruction and in-class support. This is achieved through a differentiated learning and/or behavioral support program. *Level 1 Support* provides students with 2-7 hours per week of additional support, planning and reporting at the times they need it. This may include:

- Consultative support from Student Services Teachers
- Monitoring student performance
- Literacy support (reading, writing, speaking and listening)
- Mathematics support
- Small group instruction
- Student Services support withdrawal (strategies and focused skills classes)
- Additional scaffolding
- Visual representations
- Assistive technology (e.g. voice to text software)
- Personalized behavior management strategies
- Assessment accommodations
- Partial / full academic acceleration

Cost: 10,000 EURO (per year)

Differentiated Support Level 2 can be thought of as a part-time program through which learners with more specialized needs are supported in a combination of differentiated whole-class learning and small-group support, in conjunction with appropriate therapies. Students with additional needs will have a Success Plan developed by the Student Success Team to support their learning and behavior in the classroom, during specialist lessons, and in the playground as appropriate. *Level 2 Support* provides students with 8-14 hours per week of additional support, planning and reporting at the times they need it. This may include:

- Targeted 1 on 1 instruction
- Co-taught classes in core literacies
- EAL pull-out classes
- Specifically designed courses (primarily for secondary students)
- Social skills support (both in and out of the classroom)
- Study and organisational skills support
- Assistive technology
- Formal/informal accommodations (e.g. extended time for in-class and standardized testing)
- Coordination of Occupational Therapy, Speech and language therapy, Counselling, Coaching etc.
- Individual enrichment programs
- Partial / full academic acceleration

Cost: 20,000 EURO (per year)

Differentiated Support Level 3 can be thought of as a comprehensive program through which learners with more specialized needs are supported in a combination of differentiated whole-class learning and small-group support, in conjunction with appropriate therapies. Students with additional needs will have a Success Plan developed by the Student Success Team to support their learning and behavior in the classroom, during specialist lessons, and in the playground as appropriate. *Level 3 Support* provides students with 15-20 hours per week of additional support, planning and reporting at the times they need it. This may include:

- Targeted 1 on 1 instruction
- EAL pull-out classes
- Co-taught classes in core literacies
- Specifically designed courses (primarily for secondary students)
- Social skills support (both in and out of the classroom)
- Study and organisational skills support
- Assistive technology
- Coordination of Occupational Therapy, Speech and language therapy, Counselling, Coaching etc.
- Formal/informal accommodations (e.g. extended time for in-class and standardized testing)
- Individual enrichment programs
- Partial / full academic acceleration

Cost: 30,000 EURO (per year)

Additional Education Needs

AEN Support Levels 2024-25



Specialist Support is provided for children and young adults with cognitive or developmental disabilities and/or significant behavioral needs. Students with Intensive Support needs may require one-on-one (1:1) support to access the curriculum and to interact appropriately and safely with their peers. Intensive Support can include:

- Individually designed inclusion opportunities
- Speech and language therapy
- Functional academic and life skills
- Pre-vocational skills (Secondary)
- Curricular modifications
- Social skills programs
- Adaptive physical education, music and art
- Adaptive and/or assistive technologies
- Occupational Therapy
- Counselling

Cost: 30,000 – 50,000 EURO (per year)
